Creating a safe, healing community where women and their children recover from substance abuse, address trauma and deal with mental illness.

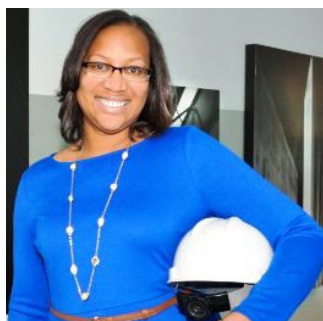
History

St. Martin de Porres House of Hope was founded in 1983 by Sr. Connie and Sr. Therese O'Sullivan to help the homeless. Some years later they decided to focus their efforts on working with substance abusers. House of Hope continues that mission today by providing women in recovery, and their children, a structured, safe environment that motivates them to achieve sobriety, become gainfully employed and live independently.



Who We Serve

100% percent of our residents are homeless women and children living in poverty. We cater to a specific demographic of the homeless population; all of our adult residents are recovering from addictions to drugs and or alcohol. And increasingly we serve women suffering from mental illnesses, Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and chronic health conditions. St. Martin de Porres House of Hope has a nondiscriminatory policy in terms of disability, race and sexuality, religious or political affiliation. We primarily serve minorities.



Counseling

Our residents participate daily in 12-step meetings and related groups. Substance abuse counselors meet weekly with women to help them stay with the program and achieve their individual plans. Counselors assist the women and their children to reconnect as family and work through their problems.

Education & Employment

St. Martin de Porres offers education and employment services both onsite and in conjunction with other partners. Employment enables our residents to take financial responsibility for themselves and their children upon leaving House of Hope. To equip our residents with the necessary tools to be competitive in today's job market we offer:

GED/Literacy Classes

Referral services to employment and vocational programs

Volunteers are the fuel that helps keep House of Hope running smoothly. We would not be able to help as many women and children as we do without volunteer assistance. Twice Read Books

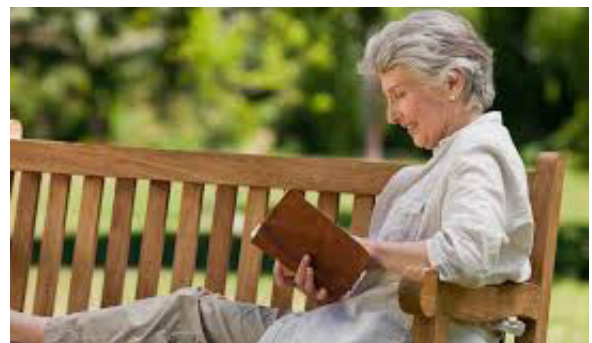
