

The mosaic table, along with others, was created by Little Black Pearl right here in Hyde Park.










Get to Know Our Special Interest Groups


Book Discussion




"I enjoy hearing the different takes on the book from the women who have read the same book as I have."





The new group took form in the summer of 2018 as events in Washington, Chicago and Springfield stirred numerous controversial issues, many involving fundamental Constitutional principles of the kind that formed the basis of high school "Civics" classes.

We meet on a rotating basis in the homes of members and we focus on issues making headlines and serving as topics in magazines, on editorial pages and in news broadcasts. We try to bring diverse perspectives by giving time to commentators from the left and the right. We meet on the second Wednesday of each month, beginning at 10:00 A.M. with coffee, tea and goodies always available. All members are welcome.


