

### **Monarch News**

Hello from the Monarch Special Interest Group! Though re-injuring my back before Thanksgiving put a crimp in winter preparation plans (I'm now mostly back to where I was before and have learned a sobering lesson about the need for daily maintenance for a middle-age body), I'd like to accomplish two monarch projects this winter (via Zoom):

planting milkweed seeds in milk jugs and other plastic containers to set outside over the winter, and
 potentially connect with workers at one of the big monarch sanctuaries in Mexico.

Before Omicron I had hoped to do the milkweed planting in person, but we had a pretty successful Zoom class last year and can repeat that. The ideal time for this event is January or early February, so the seeds can experience several more weeks of winter, which helps them germinate. For the potential Zoom meeting with workers in Mexico, either January or early March might work well. They have said the best viewing time for tourists is in February, so that's probably an especially busy month at the monarch sanctuaries.

In the meantime, there's been some interest in possible ways the Monarch Group could connect with Chicago Commons, perhaps via a Zoom version of the winter seed-sowing project and/or helping to plant some milkweed and butterfly-attracting flowers at one of their sites. If those ideas progress further, I'll keep everyone posted.

#### **DELTA LITERACY PROJECT ~~ NEW LIAISON NEEDED.**

Delta Literacy continues to be unable to tutor at their main site, 4525 S. King Drive. Olivia Amos, the Executive Director, encourages the tutors to stay in touch with their students by phone and email. She urges both tutors and students to get the COVID vaccine.



Tutors reach out to the students by phone instead of online or in person sessions. Delta hopes to restart their math and reading tutoring and other programs when it is safe.

The Southside Center of Hope (SSCH) continues to receive new residents, all adults without children. Most of the young ladies are adjusting well. They all attend intensive Outpatient Services at Healthcare Alternative Systems because of behavorial health needs.

In the spring, the SSCH will be partnering with Chase Bank to teach financial literacy classes. Spring will also bring the resumption of yoga therapy and art therapy programs. Further, in January the SSCH will start applying to become a licensed recovery home with the State.
